## Reading Genres and Terms Defined

## Terms

- Nonfiction refers to informational books.
- Fiction refers to chapter book stories.

## Genres

- (NF)Biography: the account of a person's life written by someone else.
- (NF)Collective Biography: the account of the life of two or more people.
- (NF)Autobiography: a personal account of one's life.
- © (NF)Poetry: A kind of writing set out in short lines using rhythm or rhyme that expresses or evokes feelings.
- (NF)General Nonfiction: An information book that is not poetry or biographical.
- © Science Fiction: Fantasy based on real or imaginary science. It may involve outer space, time travel or aliens.
- Historical Fiction: Based on real events of the past but uses imagined events or
   dialogue to enhance and fill out details.
- © Fantasy: A story that could not really happen in the real world.
- © Realistic Fiction: Believable fiction stories that could happen in the real world.
- © Classics: Fiction stories that remain popular 50 years or more from the original publishing date.
- Mystery: A fiction story with a crime or puzzling event that needs to be solved.
- © Sports fiction: A fiction story that revolves around sports.
- © Christian Fiction: A fiction story written by a Christian or published by a Christian publisher.
- Anthology: A collection of short fiction stories.
- © Graphic Novel: A fiction or nonfiction story that is presented in comic book format.
